Research

- Annual Requests for Proposals target the industry's most pressing needs.



Education

- Timely and relevant educational programs for industry professionals, retailers, and foodservice operators.
- Content focuses on product safety, humane animal handling, labor issues, and environmental concerns.
- Workshops, seminars, and webinars address emerging issues.



Scholarships

- Annual merit-based scholarships awarded to exceptional students pursuing careers in meat science and related fields.
